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Playtime Snacks.

Pupils in Reception and Key Stage One receive free fruit for snack as part of the Government scheme. Pupils are all allowed to bring a morning play snack which may consist of fruit or vegetables. Pupils will not be allowed to have crisps and biscuits as part of their playtime snack.

School uniform and lost property

The attendance of the classes will be shared weekly and a reward will be given to the class with the highest attendance.
